

Dear Friend,

When I joined the Ross Memorial Hospital team 20 years ago, I wasn't the only new arrival. In 2001, the hospital acquired its first CT Scanner – **truly a landmark achievement for local patient care.** 

Prior to that time, patients faced three month delays for CT appointments out of our region. It was not unusual to be told your CT scan would take place in Toronto in the middle of the night. Knowing that your treatment plan depended on the information that would come from the CT scan made it an agonizing wait for patients.

That high-priority purchase for our community wouldn't have happened without generous donations from caring people like you.

As you know, technology evolves with shocking speed. Nowhere is this more evident than in medical science. CT imaging progressed rapidly, and thanks to donors' support in 2011, our community acquired a more advanced model producing images with pinpoint accuracy, using less radiation and in less time.

As a general surgeon, I am keenly aware of how important it is for patients to get CT scans as quickly as possible.

To localize internal bleeding, to diagnose blood clots and stroke, and to guide cancer treatments ... **<u>CT imaging is our partner in precision care</u>**.

It's a critical component of how we plan our patients' safest path forward.

CT provides precise anatomic images and can thereby identify abnormalities in multiple organs. It can assist surgeons in treating patients with bowel obstructions, perforation of the stomach or intestines, appendicitis, pancreatitis and hernias. In addition, it can be extremely valuable in assessing patients for and assisting in the treatment of post-operative complications.

Trauma cases are another example. In order to provide optimum care after a serious injury, it's imperative that we can assess the extent of a patient's internal injuries. A CT can help us determine if we can stabilize and care for the patient at the Ross or if they must be transported to a trauma centre in another region.

For our cancer patients, CT has many applications. It can inform us as to whether or not a tumour involves multiple anatomical structures, potentially necessitating the planning of a more complex surgical procedure.

It also allows us to assess whether a cancer has spread to other sites in the body, permitting us to improve a patient's prognosis by initiating other treatments such as chemotherapy or radiation first, prior to embarking upon surgery. In other words, sometimes it assists the surgeon in deciding when surgery *isn't* the best course of action.

<u>Skillful attention to detail can be the difference that saves a patient's life</u>. That's why surgeons at the Ross work closely with the doctors in the Emergency Department and the radiologists who read CT scans to give every patient their best chance. Together, we are partners in precision care.

## But we need your help.

The pace of scientific advancements and the constant use of our CT scanner pose a challenge. In order to ensure patients have access to life-saving imaging 24/7, we need to replace our current scanner with a new, state-of-the-art model that will help us diagnose even more complex cases. This is not a cost the hospital receives government funding to cover. *It's up to us as a community to make it happen.*
