DEFINING CARE

A simple comment, written into the Ross Memorial's Annual Report of 1916, led to a defining moment and transformed care for local patients:

"The Medical Staff would appreciate an equipment for X-Ray examinations..."

That statement captured the attention of James Ross, who donated the funds necessary to build the Hospital in 1902, naming it in memory of his parents. It was Ross' desire that the Hospital be equipped with the best medical tools, and provide the highest standard of care to the community he once called home.

So James Ross donated \$2,550 to purchase an X-Ray machine for the Ross Memorial. It was a landmark acquisition at the time – technology only available at the largest hospitals in the country.

One hundred years later, X-Ray technology is still defining care. It is among the most trusted tools physicians count upon to help diagnose injury and illness.

The RMH Foundation is pleased to be partnering with RMH Chief of Radiology, Dr. Paul Wilson, to release the 2018 Spring Appeal to raise funds for X-Ray technology enhancements in the Diagnostic Imaging Department.

One hundred years ago, James Ross showed us that one generous gesture can make a profound difference in the lives of others. Today, the generosity of local donors continues to impact patient care.



James Ross was born in Scotland in 1848, to parents Captain John and Mary Ross. In 1868, Ross came to North America, and held a number of influential positions in the construction of several North American railways.




Thanks to local donors, our next chapter of breast health care is soon to begin. Last fall, the RMH Foundation asked for your help to purchase a 3D mammography unit, so Radiologists can detect small cancers sooner by pinpointing the exact size and location of a breast lesion.

Thanks to your generous response to the Tales of Hope Holiday Appeal, the Foundation's fundraising goal of \$170,000 was exceeded!

When added to other gifts made by individuals and organizations passionate about enhancing breast imaging, we have now raised \$298,000 toward the \$400,000 cost of a 3D mammography unit with biopsy capability. 

Remembering Dr. Summers

The Ross Family was saddened by the loss of Dr. Leslie Summers on January 15, 2018. Dr. Summers came to RMH in May 2002 as the first hospitalist caring for unattached inpatients. Under his strong leadership the Hospitalist program was developed. In 2002, Dr. Summers was responsible for up to 35 inpatients with other physicians filling in on weekends. By 2003 the program had grown to 60 – 70 inpatients and a part-time hospitalist was hired. The program continued to grow and now has six full time hospitalist lines and is responsible for managing up to 125 inpatients. Over the years Dr. Summers held many leadership roles within the organization; some of which included Chief of Hospitalist Medicine, Clinical Director of Continuing Care, Chair of



Health Records and Chair of Infection Control and Prevention, instrumental in developing collaborative Mental Health Program. In 2008, Dr. Summers was awarded the James Ross Award of Excellence for his professionalism, kindness and his dedication to providing excellent patient care. Dr. Summers was a good friend to many and will be sadly missed.



Altogether, 13 RMH departments took part in the Valentine Food Drive, which benefits the Kawartha Lakes Food Source (KLFS). The KLFS stocks small, community foodbanks throughout the area.
