The RMHF Gratitude Report



From the Intensive Care Unit to the Surgical ward, the Palliative/Complex Care Unit to the Maternity and Medical Units, patients at Ross Memorial Hospital rely on bedside IV pumps to safely receive medication, fluids and nutrition. "IV pumps are our partners," says Steven Lofkrantz RPN. Steven is one of three RMH nurses who are helping the Foundation launch the Comfort and Care Holiday Appeal to fundraise for new IV pumps.

"IV pumps are integral to patients' care — whether they're receiving life-saving treatment in the ICU, or recovering from surgery, or spending meaningful time with family in the Palliative Care Unit," said Erin Coons, RMH Foundation CEO. "IV pumps are in use

throughout the hospital, night and day. As a result of their constant use, they need to be replaced regularly, and that's why we're reaching out to the community for support."

The hospital has 170 IV pumps, each equipped with a wireless computer and the latest safety software that can dispense various medications and fluids simultaneously and ensure each dose is accurate and appropriate for the patient. Each costs on average \$5,000.

"Most of us have been connected to an IV pump at some point in our lives, and we know just how important it is to have IV pumps at the ready 24/7," said Heather Richardson, RMHF Board Chair. "Government funding doesn't cover the cost of replacing vital medical equipment. Without the generosity of our donors, the healthcare team at the Ross would be hard-pressed to provide the exceptional care our patients need. Your support makes all the difference."

RMH, surgeons and their teams celebrated for best cancer care wait times in Ontario

A cancer diagnosis is a frightening, life-altering experience. Receiving timely access to care is of paramount importance. For patients at Ross Memorial Hospital, there are many people working with the patient and

behind the scenes to expedite referrals to specialist consultation and treatment.

This fall, RMH was proud to be recognized by Cancer Care Ontario (CCO) as the **Top Performing Hospital for Cancer Surgery Wait Times—Time from Referral to Consult**. CCO issued congratulations to the RMH team for achieving the lowest wait times in the province from referral to consultation with a surgical oncologist within all priority categories.

The four priority categories and wait time (access) targets for oncology procedures range between 24 hours and 35 days and consider factors including the level of suspicion of cancer and biopsy results.

Ensuring patients have the fastest access to care is a team effort, including RMH staff, surgeons, and their community office staff. Together, these partners work to enhance cancer services in the community. We look forward to sharing more information about local oncology services in the future.

RMH celebrates Accreditation with Exemplary Standing

Ross Memorial Hospital's focus on quality patient care was recognized by Accreditation Canada in October. The hospital received the highest possible level of accreditation: Accreditation with Exemplary Standing. Together, the team met 99.6% of the required quality standards – an incredible result. This is also the third time in a row that the hospital has achieved this standing. "Everyone at the Ross, including our staff, physicians and volunteers, is involved in the accreditation process, and strives to deliver exceptional care and services, every day," says Veronica Nelson, Interim President & CEO, Ross Memorial Hospital.

Accreditation Canada surveyors follow the patient journey through an organization, including observing care

provision; speaking to staff, patients and families; and reviewing policies and files. They also speak to community partners to understand the organization's reputation locally. The accreditors noted several strengths in the hospital's operations, including its strong focus on patients and families as partners in care; and collaboration with partner organizations. They also noted the staff culture at RMH, is "positive, warm and welcoming."

"This honour reflects our commitment to continually improving our care, so that we can meet the needs of our community today, and as we look to the future," said Ms. Nelson.

In April 2002, work was well underway on the north end of the property as RMH began to double in size with an expanded Emergency Department, a Mental Health Unit, Palliative Care and Continuing Care wing.



Thanks to you, RMH installed its first CT Scanner 20 in February 2001 and patients no longer needed to travel to other regions for vital CT imaging.



In 2001, RMH employees challenged each other to a bed race down Kent St. to raise funds and awareness of the Caring For Tomorrow capital campaign. The staff fundraising campaign, the Olympics for Tomorrow, raised \$189,000 for the Hospital's major expansion!
